Penn Primary School

As part of our Social Value offering to Acivico Ltd, Dodd Group recently developed a Sensory and Wellbeing Room for Penns Primary School including external works and renovation. The work commenced in mid-August and was completed in November 2024

The project involved a full refurbishment of an existing outbuilding to provide a space for neuro divergent and SEN pupils. Prior to this, support for these pupils happened in the school corridors, which was unsafe and detrimental to their learning.

Apprentice Case Study

Scott, our front-line IT Support hero, joined us as an Apprentice 18 months ago. During his time at Dodd Group, Scott has tackled a major internet meltdown, adapted to new team members, and handled a last-minute contract mobilisation, all while managing the daily flood of calls about crashing computers, stubborn printers, and uncooperative laptops. Scott was nominated for Apprentice of the Year and previously, Employee of the Month. We are so proud to say Scott completed his Information Technician Apprenticeship and passed with a DISTINCTION.



PA housing

As part of our Social Value, we donated £7,088 to PA Housing for food vouchers and fuel vouchers. This is essential around this time of year and during the cost of living crisis.

As part of this, we also held a well-attended coffee morning, in which an engineer came to give a talk on how to use their heaters efficiently and safely and assisted residents with any issues arising.



Vivo Defence Services

As part of our Social Value commitments to our biggest Defence Client Vivo, we helped to build a much needed outdoor play and teaching area for the Lizard Child Trust Nursey in Cornwall. We donated £3,000 to the project as well as Dodd employees time free of charge. Many children from military families based at RNAS Culdrose use the nursery and this project will allow children to learn and play outside even when it rains.

Sustainability

Following our LAD3 project, we pledged £53,000 of CSR spend back into the communities of Acocks Green and Balsall Heath, through ongoing CSR projects. The Acocks Green Fox Hollies Centre was used by the community group to support customers throughout the onboarding process of LAD3, a government funded Department for Energy Security and Net Zero retrofit scheme administered via Acivico Group and Birmingham City Council. We have now installed 22.4kw of solar PV on the roof of the community centre, reducing the carbon output by circa 6 tons per year and supplying circa 40% of the centre's electricity off grid. Acocks Green also allocated additional funds to help increase the number of panels on this the project.



Northampton College

We are pleased to support the next generation of skilled professionals by donating the contents of our material £1,000 stores to Northampton College. Northampton College continue to educate a host of different trade skills and apprenticeship schemes within the construction industry, and we continue to support them by donating stock material that can no longer be used as material on our current or future projects.

Women Into Engineering

Women remain vastly underrepresented in engineering due to gender stereotyping, systemic bias, and a lack of visible role models. This year's theme is hashtag #Enhancedbyengineering. INWED gives women engineers around the world a profile when they are still hugely under-represented, with 2021 figures indicating that in the UK only 16.5% of engineers are women. and highlight the diverse career paths available to inspire women in STEM professions.

Roydon Primary Academy

This was one of three we completed as part of the DfE's 7 pilot de-carbonisation projects in 2023. From award of the works, it was a pleasure to collaborate with all parties involved and highlight innovation in the geothermal sector along with enhancing the fabric of the buildings. The intrusive nature of the works in a live environment was challenging and to deliver this project on time and within budget is credit to all involved. Following this Dodd Group donated a £5,000 cheque to the school. Contract Manager, Elliott Whitakker, also led a 'site visit' for some of the pupils showing how the new system works.

BACKGROUND:

Dodd Group were awarded first place on Lot 2 of the CWM2 Repairs and Maintenance Framework in March 2020 and continue to deliver a range of facilities management services to Acivico Ltd via this framework. This includes M&E servicing, repairs and maintenance; building fabric repairs and maintenance; 24/7/365 reactive services; and planned project works. We work in circa 900 commercial properties for Acivico across Birmingham, completing around 6,500 servicing visits, 3,000 minor works jobs, 6,000 reactive repairs and 40 planned projects p.a.

Due to its size, longevity and the dedication of the delivery team at our Smethwick branch, this has become one of Dodd Group's flagship contracts, and it continues to be the standard bearer for social value collaboration, management and implementation.
